Informal Browsing - Most College Reps Located in Gyms

- Most college representatives are stationed in alphabetical order by name of school at tables (T) in the two SM East gymnasiums.
- First half of alphabet in the south gym (to the left at entrance).
- Second half of alphabet in the north gym (to the right at entrance).
- Browse, talk to representatives, pick up information.

Where to Find More Information

The SM College Clinic is just one resource for college information. Information can be found in many places including the following sources.

Your High School Counselor: When it comes to your college search you should know your counselor by name - and they should know you. Schedule a time to talk with your counselor. They may be your best resource to guide you through your college search. They won't mind if you ask a basic question!

College Planning Websites & Books: Websites include...collegeboard.org, petersons.com, collegeprowler.com, collegeconfidential.com. There are many books to choose from and many are available at the public library and/or have websites. A few to look for: *Fiske Guide to Colleges* (fiskeguide.com), *The College Board Book of Majors, Colleges That Change Lives* (CTCL.org), *The Insider's Guide to Colleges, The Best 379 Colleges* (princetonreview.com).

Virtual Tour: Take a virtual tour of many campuses at CampusTours.com.

College Visit: Make a few college visits, ideally while school is in session. Take a formal tour of the campus. Arrange to sleep in a dorm and eat in the dining hall. Visit the department that interests you. Stop by some classes. Talk to students and college reps. You will learn more in person than from a website!

Personal Contacts: Talk to students and parents who have gone through the college search process. Try to connect with a student from your area who attends a school that interests you. Make a plan to meet during a vacation break and ask them questions about their school.

Fee Waivers

Many colleges and universities will waive application fees in cases of financial need. Contact the school directly to discuss application fee waivers. Ask your high school counselor about SAT and ACT fees waivers due to financial need.

Deadlines

Don't miss deadlines! Make a calendar to keep track of dates for SAT and ACT tests. Track pertinent dates for each school you are applying to, especially each school's application and scholarship application deadlines.

Honors Programs

Many state universities offer honors programs which offer the best of both worlds: class size and student teacher ratio of a small college with the resources and facilities of a large school. Be aware that sometimes there is a separate honors program application process. Make sure you pay attention to application deadlines.

Paying for College

Net Price Calculator: The net price calculator is a tool that students can use to estimate their "net price" to attend a particular college or university. It uses specific college information as well as the student's personal circumstances (family finances, grades, test scores, etc.) to come up with an estimated "net price", the difference between the "sticker" price to attend a specific college, less grants and scholarships for which a student may be eligible.

NetPriceCalculator.CollegeBoard.org offers net price calculators for many schools. Open a free College Board account, enter your data one time, and use it for many schools. If a school you are interested in is not included on the College Board net price calculator list, check the school's website.

Don't eliminate a school because of the "sticker" price. You might be surprised at the affordability of some schools - maybe your favorite school.

In-State Tuition: Some public universities and colleges offer in-state tuition rates for students in bordering states or counties in their region.

Scholarship Information: Try fastweb.com and finaid.com for information.

529 College Saving Plans: Check out your state's plan and look into the tax advantages of using a 529 savings plan even while paying for college.

Testing Basics

Depending on where you want to go to school, your ACT or SAT scores might be an important factor in getting into your school of choice. Virtually every college and university in the U.S. accepts either ACT or SAT scores. If you have time, take both tests and compare your results. Pick the test that best represents you and focus on getting your top score on that test. Tips for getting your best score:

- Take test early and consider retaking it to take advantage of "superscores". Many schools allow superscoring of ACT and SAT scores by taking the highest subscores from multiple test dates.
- Check out a testing review book with testing tips and sample tests.
- Consider taking a test prep class or private tutoring.
- Sign up for SAT & ACT question of the day online and faithfully do it!
- Don't forget to get adequate sleep in the days leading up to the test.
